## He Is Risen Indeed!

We continue in the season of Easter, and will do so until Pentecost Sunday, May 27.

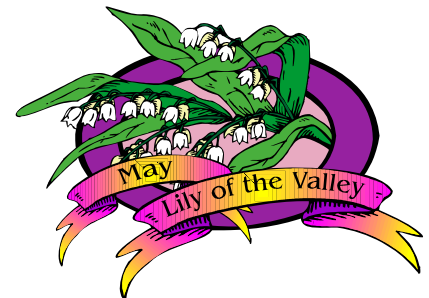

#### What you do:

1. Fold construction paper into fourths.
2. Cut paper along the folds to get four pieces.
3. On each rectangle, write words of appreciation, drawings and so on.
4. Tape the papers throughout the house. For example, a note on the refrigerator or pantry might say, "Thank you for making yummy meals for me." A note on a mirror might say, "You are beautiful inside and out!"

## From the Parish Nurse

A complaint I often hear is about trouble sleeping. While it might appear on the surface to be a minor problem, some sleep problems can actually be life-threatening. Sleep isn't just a time of "doing nothing." It is an important time for renewing mental and physical health. Sleep plays a critical role in immune function, metabolism, memory, learning, and other vital functions.

One of the more serious sleep problems is called sleep apnea. Sleep apnea is a disorder in which you have pauses in breathing while you sleep. The pauses can last from a few seconds to minutes and often occur five to 30 times or more in an hour. Usually normal breathing then starts again, sometimes with a loud snort or choking sound.

Sleep apnea is often undiagnosed. Doctors can't detect it during a routine office visit, and there are no blood tests for it. Most people who have sleep apnea don't know it, since they're asleep when it occurs. Usually a family member notices the pauses in breathing.

The most common kind of sleep apnea is obstructive sleep apnea, in which the airway collapses or is blocked during sleep. When you try to breathe, any air that squeezes past the blockage can cause loud snoring. It is most common in people who are overweight, but it can affect anyone, even children. Another kind of sleep apnea is central sleep apnea. This happens if the area of your brain that controls

breathing doesn't send the proper signals to your muscles. It may or may not occur along with obstructive sleep apnea. Snoring doesn't typically occur with central sleep apnea as it does with the obstructive form.

In addition to causing excessive daytime sleepiness, sleep apnea can increase the risk of high blood pressure, heart attack, stroke, heart failure, irregular heart beats, obesity, and diabetes, as well as increasing the chance of having work-related or driving accidents. What are some warning signs of obstructive sleep apnea? Snoring is usually the most obvious. The snoring may be so loud that it sounds like a jackhammer! The snoring is interrupted by pauses and then gasps as the person's breathing stops and then restarts. The person may fall asleep at inappropriate times, such as at work or while driving. He/she may have trouble concentrating, and can become forgetful, irritable, anxious or depressed. The most common complaint is excessive daytime sleepiness.

If you have any reason to believe you're suffering from sleep apnea, see your doctor. There are a number of treatment options, such as weight loss, avoiding certain medications, sleeping while lying on one side, oral appliances, or continuous oxygen.

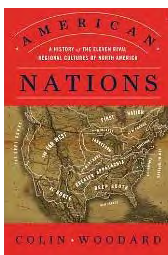

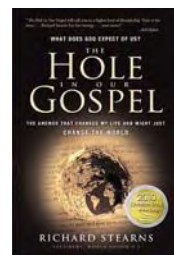
