Happy New Year everyone. Let's kick off the new year by talking about a new twist on an old crime. Theft. Specifically, jewelry stolen off you; sometimes without you even noticing it happened. Sounds unbelievable? It's true. While the most common target is women, people of any age or gender identity - - as long as they're wearing jewelry - - are potential targets.

If a stranger approaches you and asks seemingly innocuous

questions: How do I get on the 210 West? Have you seen my dog? you should put your guard up. They may also attempt to draw your attention to your jewelry (What a beautiful piece, where did you get it?) or even offer to let you try on some of theirs (This would look so good on you!).

These are all distractions and act as a reason to let them get close to you or touch the jewelry you're wearing. Even if you decline, the criminal will not be deterred. They will become more pushy, putting a ring or bracelet on you so that they can surreptitiously replace your jewelry with theirs. Unsurprisingly, the items they're forcing on you are junk. These criminals are skilled in the art of distraction and it will only be after the interaction's ended that you realize your jewelry is gone.

So, while there are many people out there legitimately confused about where the 210 entrance is or desperately searching for their dog, be skeptical if they quickly transition to discussing jewelry.

KELLY MANNING (continued from page 3) **Kelly** mentioned that in California, suicide is the 3rd leading cause of death for young people ages 10-24; and the 2nd leading cause of death among those between the ages of 25-34. However, with greater awareness of the prevalence of mental health struggles among young people, prevention is often possible through means such as initiating a "real conversation" with someone about how they are feeling, and simply showing a willingness to listen. Worries about "saying the wrong thing" at such a time shouldn't make us hesitant to reach out; and several studies show that using the word "suicide," or asking direct questions, will <u>not</u> act as trigger to cause someone to take their own life.

Kelly left a folder of resource material with us that you can access through Pastor Rick, if you are interested in pursuing this important topic. We were blessed to be able to support the work of this Foundation through one of our Endowment Fund grants for 2023.
