MESSAGE FROM THE TREASURER

Dear LCIF members and friends:

I would like to provide you with a brief update regarding the expenses incurred for recent repairs to the Tondolea property (LCIF's parsonage), where Pastor Hall and his family reside.

As you know, the property was in a state of significant need when we began this project as it has been a rental unit for more than 25 years. To date, we have incurred a total expense of \$34,436.16, which covers various necessary repairs (this includes the final payment of \$6,566.67 for A/C which will post in September), including:

* Maintenance and general repairs (\$384.46)

* Appliances (fridge, washer, dryer), ceiling fans, fixtures (toilet, faucets) (\$4,051.70)

* A/C replacement (\$19,700)

* Plumbing pipe replacement (\$10,300)

We are in the process of applying for rebates on the heat pump from SCE which could be substantial (\$1,000-2,000).

The funds to pay for these projects came from:

- * Current year's budget for maintenance and repairs at Tondolea
- * Tondolea Maintenance Reserve Fund
- * LCIF Memorial Funds (Property)

Last year, LCIF created a Tondolea Maintenance Reserve Fund and sets aside \$500 each month for large expenses. LCIF's Memorial Funds are allocated according to a formal created by the congregation which includes 10% Mission & Benevolence, 45% Property, 15% Music, 15% Programs, 10% Endowment, 5% Miscellaneous.

Thank you for your continued support and understanding as we ensure that the property is in proper living condition for Pastor Hall and his family. The property belongs to LCIF and all investments such as were undertaken this summer accrue benefits to the congregation.


