GREETINGS FROM PASTOR RICK



Lenten People,

Jesus is well on his way to the Cross. We will see that in just a short few weeks. In the meantime, we get to enter into his ministry as he heals, casts out demons, teaches and prepares his disciples for what must come. While this is a message that many do not quite comprehend at the time, it is still nec-

essary for them to hear. The disciples are hard at work alongside Jesus. Jesus is focused on Jerusalem and getting there to accomplish what he was sent for. He also knows that he must be an example for those he is teaching and those that are witnessing what is happening. Jesus knows that by loving the least of them, he is living out the love that he wants to pass along.

If I am honest, and I am one of those following along, even a disciple, I probably do not understand all that is happening. If this is the Messiah, the one sent to save and free everyone, how can he do it as a carpenter's son? How can he heal and have the authority he does? Yes, I have seen his mighty deeds and the love and compassion he has for others, but isn't the savior of the world supposed to be powerful and rich? Should he not come from better lines? It would be confusing.

As a follower of the Way some 2,000 years later, do we not face the same questions? When was the last time your God spoke to you? Who is this Jesus character? How do you know Jesus is the one sent to save? How can you be sure? Show us a sign.

Lent is a season to think about all these questions and more. A time to see how Jesus works in and through God. A time to question and look for answers. Christ's journey to the cross is great and can be followed in the Gospels, each a little different, with similar but different views.

Lent is also a time to look at ourselves and how our faith is being lived out. How are we serving those with less? How are we

LCIF'S STAINED GLASS WINDOWS



Each month in our newsletter, there is an image of a stained glass window from our sanctuary. For April, this window represents the Empty Tomb - John 30:4

This window is a picture of a new day. The sun is rising. Its bright rays reveal a 'burst' tomb. It's the third day after the crucifixion - the tomb could not contain the Savior Jesus.

In the resurrection of Jesus, God revealed for the first time the power of the new life He gives. It could not be crushed by what people called death. Jesus, in resurrection, pushed back the physical restraints that hold people captive. Death could not hold Jesus

UPDATE ON THE COMISSION FOR A RENEWED LUTHERAN CHURCH



The Commission for a Renewed Lutheran Church (CRLC) sent a draft of its final report to the Conference of Bishops and the Executive Committee of the Church Council for consultation in mid-February. The CRLC is also creating educational materials and information to prepare the wider church to receive its full report in advance of the 2025 Churchwide Assembly.

Since starting their work in July 2023, the members of the CRLC have met 11 times, and they plan to meet once more in March.
